What is some of the recent work you've been doing at Hotel Elefant?

Hotel Elefant held it's inaugural concert here in New York this spring. It featured a piece for violin and electronics that was a commission from Andie Springer, who is our incredible contemporary violinist with the ensemble. Coming up, we are preparing our fall concert and moving forward with our season.

What inspires you and how do you keep yourself motivated?

Well, my friends definitely keep me motivated, they are just amazing people and go-getters! Seeing my peers and my mentors moving ahead pushing themselves really motivates me a lot.

Are there any inspirations or people you look up to when it comes to the arts?

My teachers have been very influential: people like Roger Reynolds back in California, Steven Takasugi who's at Harvard...I am also working very closely with Michael Gordon and Julia Wolfe through the Master's program at NYU. I feel so blessed having such great teachers, composers and performers to look up to and encourage me.

What's New York city life like for you?

It's fast! It's definitely fast paced; I see the difference when I head back to California to visit. You feel the pace slow down a lot.

New York really makes you get out there and try to pursue your craft. It's also really open and friendly. The new music scene is remarkably small, which is incredible for a city with 8 million plus people. But you go to these events and you get to walk away from each concert with a few more friends. It's an encouraging and inspiring feeling.
